I just talked to the principal at length a little while ago. According to her, there is no account sharing.

Last Friday, when the kindergarten teaching initially set up the course, they give everyone (all the teachers, IAs, etc.) teacher/moderator privilege to the course. As the teachers were doing the course prep together, they saw the course changed (some folders moved around, etc.). Then they changed the permission for everyone else into student except the teachers, also reset all of their own passwords, after which the changed stopped.

I think it is a matter of over-sharing rather than account compromise. The principal will talk to one of the teachers tomorrow morning and we will talk once again afterwards. I will report back after I talk to her tomorrow morning.

By the way, I also check all five teacher's Microsoft sign-ins, there is no sign of compromise.

I'm thinking through this request and wanting to strike a realistic balance that can be reviewed by legal. FERPA and HIPPA definitely have overlap. There are several county programs that use Telemedicine that will require a HIPPA compliant platform and an expectation of ongoing remote resources for use by our social workers. 

I just talked to the principal at length a little while ago. According to her, there is no account sharing. Last Friday, when the kindergarten teaching initially set up the course, they give everyone (all the teachers, IAs, etc.) teacher/moderator privilege to the course. As the teachers were doing the course prep together, they saw the course changed (some folders moved around, etc.). Then they changed the permission for everyone else into student except the teachers, also reset all of their own passwords, after which the changed stopped.

I think it is a matter of over-sharing rather than account compromise. The principal will talk to one of the teachers tomorrow morning and we will talk once again afterwards. I will report back after I talk to her tomorrow morning.

By the way, I also check all five teacher's Microsoft sign-ins, there is no sign of compromise.

FEDERAL HEADLINES

- <u>USED Announces Process for SEAs to Request CARES Act Financial Flexibilities</u>: USED Secretary DeVos announced today the Department's process for issuing funding flexibilities to SEAs, a key component of the recently passed CARES Act. Under the new legislation, states can apply for waivers to use restricted federal education funds to support various coronavirus response initiatives, including spending more Title IV funds on distance learning infrastructure, increased flexibility regarding carryover funds, broader allowable uses for Title II, and more. According to USED's press release</u>, waivers will receive an initial determination within one business day.
- 2. <u>AASA Issues Call to Action on IDEA Flexibility</u>: AASA recently released the following Call to Action for its members to consider. The text of AASA's suggested Congressional communication is attached as well. Please contact Sasha Pudelski (<u>spudelski@aasa.org</u>) with any questions.

- <u>USED Announces Process for SEAs to Request CARES Act Financial Flexibilities</u>: USED Secretary DeVos announced today the Department's process for issuing funding flexibilities to SEAs, a key component of the recently passed CARES Act. Under the new legislation, states can apply for waivers to use restricted federal education funds to support various coronavirus response initiatives, including spending more Title IV funds on distance learning infrastructure, increased flexibility regarding carryover funds, broader allowable uses for Title II, and more. According to USED's press release</u>, waivers will receive an initial determination within one business day.
- 2. <u>AASA Issues Call to Action on IDEA Flexibility</u>: AASA recently released the following Call to Action for its members to consider. The text of AASA's suggested Congressional communication is attached as well. Please contact Sasha Pudelski (<u>spudelski@aasa.org</u>) with any questions.



**Teachers will identify one hour a day for "Parent Office Hours": to be available to connect. Individual teachers will share this time.

- <u>Specialist Office Hours</u>: Our Specialist teachers (music, PE, art, library, Spanish, CCT,....) will be posting learning activities at each grade level's FCPS 24/7 Learning (Blackboard) site. 7 Guiding Principles For Parents Teaching From Home Teaching from Home

Q and A

Are you taking any action during the closure regarding your transportation assets and drivers? During the school closures related to COVID-19, Fairfax County Public Schools is utilizing approximately 1% of the school bus fleet and driver pool to support Food Services with meal delivery.

Are bus drivers getting paid? All contracted bus drivers are paid their guaranteed hours during the school closures.

Will there be specialized AAP packets?

Grade-level Learning Packets are being distributed weekly to provide equitable access to learning experiences for all students. Starting in Week 2, Advanced Mathematics 3-6 will be included in the packets. Also starting in Week 2, middle school packets will be differentiated based on the student's math course.

How do I know if my child will be promoted to the next grade level after this school year?

For students in grades K-8, FCPS Regulation 2410 states promotion is based on classroom assessments and grade-level expectations. These decisions are made based upon a student's academic performance. For K-8 students, this would be based on student demonstration prior to school closure, based on appropriate expectations for that time of year. Students in grades K-8, will have the additional opportunity to continue to demonstrate mastery of grade level standards during this period of distance learning.

Promotion decisions rest with the principal. If a parent is not in agreement with the decision, they should discuss with the principal. If agreement cannot be reached, a parent may appeal to the Region Superintendent.

Students who were on track for promotion prior to closure will be promoted.

- <u>USED Announces Process for SEAs to Request CARES Act Financial Flexibilities</u>: USED Secretary DeVos announced today the Department's process for issuing funding flexibilities to SEAs, a key component of the recently passed CARES Act. Under the new legislation, states can apply for waivers to use restricted federal education funds to support various coronavirus response initiatives, including spending more Title IV funds on distance learning infrastructure, increased flexibility regarding carryover funds, broader allowable uses for Title II, and more. According to USED's press release</u>, waivers will receive an initial determination within one business day.

- While the majority of our dual enrollment courses are offered through Northern Virginia Community College, we also have dual enrollment courses with George Mason University, James Madison University, and Shenandoah University. Each partner has a different methodology regarding how to finish the course and we need time to work through each of these items.
- For students who want to enroll in Dual Enrollment courses for the 2020-21 school year,

information about how to complete the required registration forms will be provided during the week of April 13.



Instructional Guidelines:

2 Hours a Day: virtual teacher-directed instruction and individualized student support - when teachers are available through Blackboard Collaborate Ultra; Teachers will reach out to students to provide access

2-3 Hours a day: independent study using learning packets and choice activities; parents embed health/activity breaks during blocks below (teachers are planning, posting, providing feedback, responding to parents)

**Teachers will identify one hour a day for "Parent Office Hours": to be available to connect. Individual teachers will share this time.

- <u>Specialist Office Hours</u>: Our Specialist teachers (music, PE, art, library, Spanish, CCT,....) will be posting learning activities at each grade level's FCPS 24/7 Learning (Blackboard) site. They will also hold daily office hours for individual students to check in and connect. Students in grades 3-5 may reach specialists from 2-2:30; grades K-2 from 2:30--3:00, Monday-Thursday.
- <u>FCPS Learning Packets</u>: For the first two weeks, learning packets provide review for essential standards for each grade level. The subsequent packets will provide both new content and review of previously taught concepts. Packets have been mailed to students, and we are aware that the first set of packets arrived late. The packets are also available electronically in <u>FCPS 24/7 Learning (Blackboard)</u> and can be printed at home. Please use this <u>opt out link</u> to stop receiving the printed instructional packets in the mail. You will need your student's ID number and your e-mail address to access the opt out system.
- <u>Recorded Sessions</u>: Teachers will be recording the "Virtual Teacher-Directed Instruction" hour each day, Monday-Thursday. They will post

these sessions on <u>FCPS 24/7 Learning (Blackboard)</u> for you to access at any time for viewing.

7 Guiding Principles For Parents Teaching From Home Teaching from Home

Q and A

Are you taking any action during the closure regarding your transportation assets and drivers? During the school closures related to COVID-19, Fairfax County Public Schools is utilizing approximately 1% of the school bus fleet and driver pool to support Food Services with meal delivery.

Are bus drivers getting paid? All contracted bus drivers are paid their guaranteed hours during the school closures.

Will there be specialized AAP packets?

Grade-level Learning Packets are being distributed weekly to provide equitable access to learning experiences for all students. Starting in Week 2, Advanced Mathematics 3-6 will be included in the packets. Also starting in Week 2, middle school packets will be differentiated based on the student's math course.

How do I know if my child will be promoted to the next grade level after this school year?

For students in grades K-8, FCPS Regulation 2410 states promotion is based on classroom assessments and grade-level expectations. These decisions are made based upon a student's academic performance. For K-8 students, this would be based on student demonstration prior to school closure, based on appropriate expectations for that time of year. Students in grades K-8, will have the additional opportunity to continue to demonstrate mastery of grade level standards during this period of distance learning.

Promotion decisions rest with the principal. If a parent is not in agreement with the decision, they should discuss with the principal. If agreement cannot be reached, a parent may appeal to the Region Superintendent.

Students who were on track for promotion prior to closure will be promoted.




